HOW TO SORT YOUR WASTE AND RECYCLABLES

- Reduce and recycle your waste.
- Your collection schedule may change by month. Please check your collection calendar.
- More than five designated bags of waste at a time cannot be taken out to the regular garbage station, but must be taken to the Clean Center.
- Let each of us keep our garbage station clean.
- Make sure to take out your garbage by **8:30am** on the scheduled days.
- Each household takes turns cleaning the garbage station.

After purchase, please store it in a dry, dark place, and use it before the expiry date. ● Please do not purchase them in bulk, but buy them as you need them. ● Make sure that the shells and bones in the garbage bag don't break the bag. ● Do not put the following in the kitchen garbage bag: dead leaves, flowers, hairs, rubber bands, tapes, chewing gum, oil-soaked paper, toothpicks, disposable chopsticks, sink strainer bags, plastic wrap, weeds, cigarette butts, matches, paper, diapers, large amount of seasoning, plastic and aluminum products. ● Squeeze out the water thoroughly, and take out the bag on each scheduled day even if it is not full.
